At the borders of otherness - a decolonising translocational positionality approach to difference: releasing Kuwaiti online voices

## Abstract

This article examines the notion of difference from an intersectional translocational positionality framing. Locked in a binary reduced system difference is and excluded. Following an intersectional research approach in a Kuwaiti online context a dynamic more complex and multilayered difference emerged. Focusing on processes and systems of power and power-relations, subjects appear to occupy multiple locations and are positioned in multiple and contradictory ways. These contradictory locations where penalty and privilege intersect reveal the shifting fusions of
